The Divinity of Christ (Mark 5)

Introduction

This message is entitled: "Three Dramatic Miracles Authenticate the Divinity of Christ" Mark Chapter 5:1-43. This message was written, and delivered by Pastor and Seminary Professor R. Brian Rickett, during our Monday evening fellowship dinner and prayer meeting, at the Arkansas State Capitol.

The Central Claim: Mark 1:1 "The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God."

The rest of the book provides authentication/argumentation for this reality.

 - 1. Lord over wind and sea (4:41)

 - Healer of spiritually/physically desperate--many others tried & failed (5:14-20)
 - 4. Lord over life and death—religious leader Jairus' daughter (5:21-43)

- Three Major Movements, Three Dramatic Miracles
- Chapter 5: Observe the place of Chapter 5
 in the overall flow of Mark's record of the
 authentication of "the Gospel of Jesus
 Christ, the Son of God."
- Notice in each case, the miracle performed by Christ is contrasted with the failure of others to effect the needed result.

- I. The Gerasene Demoniac: The Man From the Tombs (1-20)A. The Man and The Spiritual Affliction (5:1-5)
 - We are immediately confronted with the reality of unrestrained, victorious evil in the life of this human being.
 - Resulted in his isolation/separation/estrangement from social & civil life

- Complete Inability to function normally
- Self-destructive—causing harm to himself
- Tormented soul
- This man is demon possessed
- In bondage—both physically & spiritually, literally & metaphorically
 - Often been bound. Note: the spiritual bondage has resulted in the effort of community members to restrain him
 - 2. Constantly crying out & bruising himself w/stone. Shows how his spiritual condition has resulted in misery/anguish/self-mutilation—little doubt that if he had the means to do so, he would have attempted suicide.
 - No mere psychological problem:
 This is a spiritual problem—a problem with a direct & immediate source clearly evidenced by unnatural behavior and supernatural capacity.
 - There is a hint that he had terrorized the people of the place. "Often..." "...all the people"
