


Bible Study for January 12th and 14th

There are three important components of effective Bible study. These three parts are observation, interpretation, and application.

Observation answers the question: “What does the passage say?” Because observation is discovering what the passage is saying, it requires time and practice.

Interpretation answers the question: “What does the passage mean?” Interpretation is not necessarily a separate step from observation, for often, as you carefully observe the text, at that very moment you begin to see what it means. Thus, interpretation flows out of observation.

Application answers the question: “How does the meaning of this passage apply to me?” Once you know what a passage means, you are not only responsible for putting it into practice in your own life, but accountable if you don’t! Ultimately, then, the goal of personal Bible study is a transformed life and a deep and abiding relationship with Jesus Christ.
