Week 3 – JONAH 2:1-10 **The Prayer of the Humble**

In Jonah's prayer of humility, he recognizes God's sovereignty over the entirety of his present condition and returns to a rightful worship of God.

1.	Pray <u>humbly</u> , earnestly, and out of your <u>need</u> .	v. 1-2
2.	Recognize the sovereignty of God. a. It is God who casts Jonah into the sea. b. It is God who raises Jonah up from the Pit.	v. 3-6 v. 3-5 v. 6
3.	Pray with thanksgiving to God. a. Jonah thanks God, the holy One. b. Jonah thanks God, the gracious One. c. Jonah praises God, the saving One.	v. 7-9 v. 7 v. 8 v. 9
4.	Repent, God will deliver.	v. 10

- 1. Remember to pray fervently and <u>specifically</u> to your Father in Heaven.
- 2. Acknowledge God's Lordship over you life and surrender your circumstances to Him.
- 3. Pray with a heart of thanksgiving for the grace you have received.
- 4. Repent and wait on God for His coming deliverance.

Jonah's Prayer

2 Jonah prayed to the Lord his God from the belly of the fish:

²I called to the Lord in my distress, and he answered me.
I cried out for help from deep inside Sheol; you heard my voice.

³ You threw me into the depths, into the heart of the seas, and the current overcame me. All your breakers and your billows swept over me.

⁴But I said, "I have been banished from your sight, yet I will look once more toward your holy temple.

⁵The water engulfed me up to the neck; the watery depths overcame me; seaweed was wrapped around my head.

⁶I sank to the foundations of the mountains, the earth's gates shut behind me forever! Then you raised my life from the Pit, Lord my God! ⁷ As my life was fading away, I remembered the Lord, and my prayer came to you, to your holy temple.

⁸ Those who cherish worthless idols abandon their faithful love,

but as for me, I will sacrifice to you with a voice of thanksgiving.
I will fulfill what I have vowed.
Salvation belongs to the Lord."
